Thank you for applying to be a mentee in the Computer Science department! To apply, please complete the attached application and email it to advisor@cs.fsu.edu.

Mentee Requirements and Responsibilities:

To be a mentee, you must simply be within the first two years (roughly speaking, a freshman or sophomore, or first semester transfer student) of a Computer Science program (Computer Science BS, Computer Science BA, Computer Programming and Applications, Computational Biology, or Computer Criminology). You simply need to apply and you will be paired with a mentor, space permitting.

As a mentee, we only require that you be open to and engage with your mentor. Your mentor is a resource and an opportunity for you to make connections with other students in the department. You should be meeting with your mentor at least once a month outside of WiCS events, but should keep open communication with your mentor throughout the rest of your time.

Also, please remember your mentor is not a tutor, so please do not request tutoring or homework/assignment assistance from your mentor. For tutoring, please see the Academic Center for Excellence.

Mentorships last for a semester, with an option to continue the mentorship in following semesters.

The application deadline for Spring 2018 mentorships is January 26.
